Dear Colonel Lag.

There are a couple of things I would like to get straightened out regarding reconnaisance cars.

First - I was given to understand by Generaly Lynch and others that these seventy special decigned cars were wanted in time for the maneuvers.

Second - Red tape was cut to a minimum in gatting the board up to the factory etc., and changes in Bantam car to meet military requirements was thoroughly discussed.

Third - We ismediately started work on four wheel drive and increase in horse power of motor etc., and ere well along. In fact if no delay by War Department, thesecars can be ready for maneuvers.

Four - In last few days I have been informed that the Q.M.G. were going to take the long way in placing orders for these cars, which if done will make in impossible to have the cars ready for maneuvers.

Five - There is no reason for this delay as the Chief of Staff's office will immediate out red tape and Asst. Secretary of War's office will facilitate permission for G.M.G. to negotitate this experimental order, provinging Gen. Lynch simply tells them he desires these cars in time for maneuvers, if possible, as he stated to me.

Sixth - I tried to reach Gen. Lynch by telephone twice last week but was side-tracked, so will you please show this letter to the General and advise me us to his wishes.

I told Gen. Lynch we could deliver cers in time end I don't went to break a promise, but if C.M.G. follows red tape course, it will delay things two weeks or more. If we are advised that this experimental order will be negotitated, then we will continue to rush these cars thru.

There are, as you know, no other auto concerns who are tooled up for this type of car, so there is no company who could bid and meet requirements as to time, etc. As you know, Congress passed a bill to allow CMG to negotiate in just such cases as this.

Ple let me hear from you immediately. in order that this project will n needlessly be delayed.
